HOW DID YOU COME TO BE INVOLVED IN THIS PROJECT? We had done previous projects with the clients - this was our third project with them.

WHAT WAS THE BRIEF? This is a summer home for our clients and their teenage children and where they entertain extended family and friends. They wanted the decor and colour scheme to reflect a beach/coastal vibe. We were brought in to help with customising finishes as well as fully furnishing the interiors.

HOW INVOLVED WERE THE HOMEOWNERS?

Since this was our third project working with these clients, we already had a good sense of their likes and dislikes. They are familiar with our work ethic and design process so while we did work semi-closely with them to finalise finishes, fabrics and furniture, they ultimately trusted that they were in good hands. DESCRIBE THE HOMEOWNERS' STYLE. Being a summer home mostly for entertaining, they wanted to

maximise seating where possible and keep the style and comfort of the home casual, while reflecting a coastal feel. Their style is mostly transitional and elegant yet understated.


WHAT WERE THE BIGGEST PRIORITIES FOR THE HOMEOWNERS? Comfort was a big motivator. They also wanted to allow for the fact that their children are now teenagers and like to bring their friends over. That being said, the biggest alteration made to the original house plan was an

extension to the second floor that could be used as a bunk bedroom, almost camp style.

WHICH ROOM WAS THE MOST IMPORTANT TO THE HOMEOWNERS? While there was care taken to design all the rooms, I think they wanted to focus mostly on the new custom bunk bedroom. It was the most designed room in the house. HOW DID YOU CHOOSE THE COLOUR PALETTE? As the clients wanted a beach vibe, the colour

palette is mostly light neutrals with pops of blues. We wanted to incorporate interest through the use of textures, natural materials and warm woods.

WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE?

The biggest challenge was working so remotely – we are based in New York – and having to design from afar. We had to work closely with the contractor for any information we needed. The first day we came to the site was during the furniture installation.

WHAT WAS THE MOST SATISFYING ASPECT OF THIS PROJECT? There were so many moving parts in this project with the added challenge of having to design remotely so not having any major design disasters is definitely satisfying. WHAT IS YOUR ADVICE FOR CREATING A SUCCESSFUL SCHEME? Start with a central inspiration, which usually is either a fabric or a rug, and have all the other selections tie into it. Studiolabdesign.com
